FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I must admit, I get excited when I see the improvement and growth in our students as writers. During my visits to classrooms over the past couple of weeks, it has been very pleasing to see such high levels of engagement and focus on a variety of writing genres including persuasive texts. An example of this is talking with students in a Year 3/4 classroom. They were able to clearly articulate the intention of the writing lesson, why they were learning this and how they could measure their success with it.

Here are some examples:

What is your learning intention?

"To identify the structures and features of a persuasive text".

"Right now I am annotating my work to identify things that help it to be more persuasive".

Why are you learning this?

"To help us understand different persuasive devices and structures and how we can then write better and more persuasive arguments".

How do you know that you are being successful?

"If you can identify the purpose of a persuasive piece such as the OREO (opinion, reason, evidence, opinion) in a paragraph and find and highlight the specific structures".

When I hear responses such as this, I reflect back to my own time at primary school and am amazed at how far we have come in education since then. I don't think I ever took the time or was provided with the opportunity to develop an understanding of what I was learning and why I was learning it!

ASSEMBLY ARRANGEMENTS

As our hall refurbishment continues, we will hold our fortnightly assemblies through a live stream on You Tube. This is filmed out of the Library and students across the school can log in at 3pm to watch and listen from their classrooms.

Parents are able to attend individual classrooms or the Library to watch assemblies. This way you can still be there to see your child being awarded Student of the Week or one of the Specialists awards. These are always outlined in CONTACT in the week/s before each assembly.

Whilst this has been an effective solution without access to our hall we do look forward to hosting regular assemblies as a whole school again later in Term 2.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTION & ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Our School Council election closes today at 4pm. After I count the votes tomorrow, I will announce the results via email.

Next Monday 2nd March at 6.45pm, we will hold our first school council meeting for 2020. This is where office bearers such as School Council president will be elected. School Council meetings are held in the staffroom.

At this meeting we will also establish our sub-committee structure and schedule for this year.

These committees are open to all members of our school community to join and where the work of School Council is actually done. It is great to have a mix of parents and carers from across the school on each of these. All of our school council members also serve on at least one of these sub-committees. I will outline the role of each sub-committee in the newsletter next week along with the time and dates for the meetings which are twice per term).
