REFLECTION IS NO LONGER A NEGATIVE WORD @ GREENHILLS

This year we have fine-tuned our behaviour management procedure by replacing the consequence known as a "Reflection" with a "Restorative Process". The reason behind this is that it is vital for 21st century students to be reflective about their learning. In education speak this is known as "metacognition" and it is also one of the evidenced based High Impact Teaching Strategies" being used effectively in DET schools.

In fact, because reflective thinking is so important, we are making time for our whole school to focus on this by moving our assemblies to every second week and alternating with a whole school reflection time. We will keep you updated with the various dates for both assemblies and reflection times and provide some ideas and resources for you to follow up at home with what we are doing as a school.

START OF THE DAY PROCESS CHANGE FOR 2019

We have slightly changed the bell times for the start of the school day.

The music will now start each day at 8.55am (2 minutes earlier than last year) with a short bell at 8.57am. This is the signal for all students to enter their classrooms and get ready for learning before the longer 9am bell rings.

We know that getting off to a GREAT start each day is critical for learning, so we are encouraging everyone to be on time and ready to go inside classrooms by the 9am bell.

At the other end of the day, a bell will now also ring at 3.45pm.

This is a reminder to any student who remains unsupervised that they need to report to the office so that we can ensure they get home safely or arrangements are made for After School Care if parents/carers are delayed after this time.

ROAD SAFETY AROUND SCHOOLS

Speed zones, pedestrian crossings and parking restrictions around school are there to improve the movement of traffic during peak times and maximise safety for children and road users.

It is vital that as adults, we lead by example and set good road safety practices travelling to and from school. As such we are asking all parents and carers to observe and obey parking signs and in particular No Stopping and No parking signs.

Banyule City Council have asked us to remind our school community that it is an offence to:

double park by stopping next to a legally parked vehicle, even for a short time or to drop off/pick up passengers Stop or park across a driveway, footpath or dividing strip

Stop or park within 10 metres of an intersection or corner that doesn't have traffic lights

Stop or park across or in a bus zone.

Council Local Laws Officers will be active around our school area to issue warnings and fines.

HAVE INPUT INTO OUR SCHOOL...

We know that one of the best things about our school is our strong parent input and involvement. Our School Council is one of the main forums in which parents and staff work together for the benefit of all our students. At the beginning of each school year we have a number of vacancies for School Council. There are 3 x Parent member positions to fill this year for a period of two years and 1 x Casual vacancy positions for parents this year.
