THANK YOU SEMESTER 1

Wow – we made it through to the end of a long and action packed term. Looking at our staff I think we only just made it and the holidays have come at the perfect time for everyone.

This has been a semester like never before. If you remember back to what seems almost a lifetime ago, we had an amazingly settled start following our transition program and things were off to a really positive beginning. Then we moved into very challenging and confronting territory as we worked through the experiences of Remote & Flexible Learning and of course our return to school. Now we are in that uneasy state that we call the "new normal". We have faced and continue to grapple with a very shifting landscape and as we finish the term, there is still so much that we can't control and so many unknowns.

What I do know is how proud I am of our staff, students and families for all working together in such a united way through these challenges. We have achieved so much together and can take comfort in the support everyone has provided to each other.

There have been many highlights and things that will stay with me for a long time, but I think one of our Year 6 students has summed it up the best in his self-reflection as part of his Semester 1 Report.

Overall remote learning wasn't bad but I'll always prefer proper school".

DROP OFF ZONE

I know that getting to and from school on time each day can be a parent's worst nightmare! I also know that there has been lots of chatter about our drop off zone on the various "unofficial" Facebook pages attached to our school.






I've done some research and calculations:

There are six car parks in this zone. If there is 15 minutes in the morning to drop off (e.g. 8.40am – 8.55am) so that students get to school on time, and there are 6 car spots in the zone between the no-parking signs, and if the average "kiss and drop" takes no more than 1 minute, and if parents don't park their car there and leave it so that there is only 5 spots left....we could get.....drum roll please......90 drops offs to happen smoothly during that time. We could get even more drop offs completed by not even taking one minute. In fact I have been taking a close look over recent mornings and in many cases, cars can be in and out in around 30 seconds.

I have seen it work really well and we can ensure this continues if we all contribute by doing the right thing.

The "drop-off loop" also enables smoother traffic flow. When a car tries to do a U-turn after the drop-off and heads back up Mine Street instead of continuing down and turning right into Albion Crescent – it really holds up the flow.



I will keep trying to monitor and be in attendance out the front gate and also keep communicating this message. We will explore improved signage and road markings but most importantly, you can assist by keeping to this process all of the time.

What a term we have just experienced. There has been many key learnings for all of us and although there has been times when things have been difficult I believe the positive things that have come from this experience will stay with us moving forward.

One positive outcome that I would like to share is an exciting new initiative from the Victorian Government, the online Triple P program.

The Victorian Government has funded the online Triple P – Positive Parenting Program for all Victorian families, providing access to expert parenting advice during these challenging times.

The program is the online version of the Triple P Program that was developed in Australia and successfully implemented around the world.

Families can now access free expert parenting advice through the online Triple P – Positive Parenting Program.

The program is relevant to families with children between 2 and 16 years and provides strategies to deal with specific challenges, such as building children's resilience and dealing with conflict.

There are courses specifically for parents of toddlers to tweens, and for parents of pre-teens to teens.

It gives parents strategies to:

- raise happy, confident kids
- manage misbehaviour so everyone in the family enjoys life more
- set rules and routines that everyone respects and follows
- encourage positive behaviour
- take care of themselves as a parent
- feel confident they're doing the right thing.
