

TRACEY EZARD "THE BUZZ" STAFF PROFESSIONAL LEARNING UPDATE



Each year all of our staff undertake a very extensive professional learning program. Time is set aside for this through the four pupil free curriculum days allocated to schools during the year and sessions after school each week, usually on a Wednesday. We all undertake this learning to improve our skills and knowledge. I am pleased to say that our staff team embrace this concept of continuous improvement with enthusiasm and commitment.

During our second curriculum day on Monday of this week, all of our staff spent the day with consultant Tracey Ezard around further developing "The Buzz" of our thriving and collaborative learning culture. Tracey is a very skilled presenter and she was able to inspire and skill our staff in raising the bar around the challenging conversations we have in regards to improving student outcomes and designing engaging, high-level learning.

We are now looking forward to our next curriculum on Friday 14th June where we will work with Glen Pearsall on our Instructional Model with a particular focus on the High Impact Teaching Strategies of Explicit Teaching & Metacognition.

As a parent myself, I understand the inconvenience of curriculum days. However, it is important to know how important these four days are to a school staff team. One of the most important ways for our school to continue to deliver high quality learning and growth for students is through staff professional learning. Curriculum days provide the only significant opportunity for the whole staff team to work together over the course of a day, focused on professional learning and school improvement. As such, we prioritise these days based on our school needs and direction. This often means timing these days around a guest facilitator or expert's availability and the work plan of the school.


