GREAT NEWS.....OCTOBER 21 BUILDING START DATE!



We met with the Architects, Builder and the Victorian School Building Authority on Monday of this week and the project will commence on Monday 21st October.

PARENT COMMUNICATION

A the end of Term 3, it was wonderful to see so many parents attend the Student Led Conferences. Communication between home and school is extremely important and something we take very seriously as we are keenly aware of the benefits to students of a team approach. Students benefit most when parents and teachers work in partnership. To this end, it is important that communication is ongoing and not just something that occurs after reports go home or when a problem arises.

We are very lucky at Greenhills Primary to have a team of staff who are extremely professional their approach and who are passionate about providing the best possible education for all students in their class.

This is reflected in the results of two recent parent feedback surveys.




Our Survey Monkey focused on school communications. Of the 39 families who completed the survey (which was open to the whole school), 85%reported that the level of communication from the school is "just right".

Pleasingly 90% of responses indicated that the Newsletter was the primary channel to find out about information from the school and another 90% read it weekly (I guess if you are reading this newsletter – you already know this!)

It was also positive to see that the work our staff have done within each team and across the school to ensure a consistent level of communications is having an impact with 69% of survey responses indicating that the level of information from your class teacher is "just right".

Our school communications plan ensures that at the beginning and in the middle of each term, an email is sent home to all parents outlining key information about our learning programs and important reminders. Our blogs are also updated frequently and we are starting to use the Sentral messaging function as well. When you look at all the formal contact points that are organised throughout the year e.g. parent meet the teacher interviews, Semester reports, Student led conferences, emails and Curriculum Tracker it means that our staff are in communication with you at a minimum of 4 times each term or 16 times throughout the year and in many cases much more than this.



The DET Parent Opinion Survey which was completed by 93 randomly selected parents also provides very positive feedback about our teacher communication. For the question "There is effective two-way communication between the teachers and parents at this school" 85% of responses were Positive, 7% Neutral and 9% Negative.

PARENT REQUEST PROCESS FOR TRANSITION INTO 2020

Our team have begun the process of finalising our school structure for 2020. Considerations around the social, emotional, academic and physical needs of each of our students will form part of this process. Parents are able to make requests for consideration when placing their child into their 2020 class. These requests will only be accepted in writing (including email) and must be received by Friday 25th October. Please note that requests with respect to specific teachers will not be considered.

Our staff will use this information as part of all the different considerations taken when building our grades. These factors include the social, emotional, physical and academic needs of all students. It is a complex and time consuming task as we try to ensure that we set up the best possible structure for a successful 2020. During this entire process our decisions are always guided by one major factor and that is the best interests of our students. Details relating to the school organisation, classes of children and the allocation of teachers will be released to students at our "Meet and Greet" day on Friday 6th December.



DEVELOPING HOME-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

CONVINCE ME!

Kids of all ages are excellent at wearing down the resistance of a parent who denies permission for them to go somewhere due to lack of safety or suitability concerns. Unfortunately, many kids use annoying methods such as:

- repetition (Can I go? Can I go?)
- questioning (Why can't I go?)
- guilt (You never let me go anywhere!)
- nagging (Can I, can I, can I go, pleeease!) and
- whining (Ahhh! Whyyy Caaan't I gooo!)

Often we are so tired that we give just to gain some peace, which makes pester power a useful strategy as kids achieve what they want. Our hope is that our kids are able to avoid or counter the risk as much as humanly possible. One way of assessing this is asking them to convince you that they are responsible, old enough and possess sufficient awareness to go into new situations and places.

One way to avoid this pestering is to ask them to convince you that they are responsible enough, mature enough or aware enough to be allowed to go somewhere.

Here is an example: "Amelia, I'm not sure that I should allow you to walk home with your friends. I am worried that it might not be safe. Convince me that you can do so safely."

This response puts the onus back on the child or young person to think to counter your concerns. Listen carefully to their response, as it will indicate whether they really have considered your concerns and are aware of the depth or range of potential difficulties.

Simplistic responses don't cut it

If they respond with simplistic comments such as, "I'll be okay", "we'll stick together" and "I won't do anything silly" then they are probably unaware or unprepared for contingencies that may arise. However if they provide a response with more depth, they may demonstrate their readiness. An example for this might be "I know you are worried that we might not cross the road safely. That worries me too. We'll make sure that we hold hands and looks both ways and only cross when there are no cars coming."

Minimising risk

Answers such as the above show they understand your concerns but also that they have some strategies in mind to minimise risk. As a parent, we would like to remove risk from our kids' lives but this is unrealistic. As kids grow up their world rapidly expands taking them further away from the safe confines of home, and exposing them to new and potentially risky situations and people. Our hope is that our kids are able to avoid or counter the risk as much as humanly possible. One way of assessing this is asking them to convince you that they are responsible, old enough and possess sufficient awareness to go into new situations and places.

"Convince me!" may well be the smartest two words you will ever use as a parent. It may stop pester-power in its tracks and at the same time induce your child to think ahead and better prepare for spreading their wings when you do not feel they are quite ready.
