

#### **NEWS FROM THE PRINCIPAL**

Each week I have the pleasure of spending time in our classrooms, getting to know our students and seeing the teaching and learning in action. One of my favourite places to visit is our Prep classrooms. The first year of school is such a wonderful time. Our preps are always so excited, curious and ready to learn – and that includes our teachers as well!

The other great part of visiting our classrooms is seeing our Instructional Model in place.



Our Model is a sequence through which learning in each lesson is structured and delivered. This provides a framework where teachers can articulate what they are teaching and why they are teaching it.

It is evidence based best practice built on the Department of Education and Training's High Impact Teaching Strategies and Practice Principles for Excellence in Teaching & Learning. As a high performing school, we are constantly striving to reduce any variations between classrooms. This Model supports teachers to develop a shared language about practice.

In each newsletter over the next 7 weeks, I will unpack each of the elements of the model starting with "The Hook". As the name suggests, this is about engaging the learner at the beginning of the lesson. Our hook is designed to stimulate interest, curiosity and connect the learning to previous learning or real world experiences and can often take the form of a game. Importantly it also provides an opportunity for students to demonstrate their current level of understanding through their responses, which provides GREAT feedback to our teachers at the beginning of each lesson.

#### **MEET WITH THE TEACHER INTERVIEWS**

Thank you to all those that attended our Meet the Teacher evening yesterday. We also have a shorter session running next Wednesday. Communication with our parents is very important to us. One of our key goals in the implementation of our school vision is building a strong and cohesive home – school partnership. We organise events such as Meet the Teacher Interviews, Student Led Conferences and Prep Information evenings to enrich this partnership. Thank you to our staff team for organising the interviews.

#### **SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTION 2019**

Thank you to Irina Fainberg, Kelly Rogel, Adam Laws, Joanne Thom, Helen Schilling, Kris Headley & Beth Costello for nominating as candidates for election to our School Council. We have 3 x 2 year vacancies to fill and another 1 x casual vacancy for a 1-year term.

Election material has been sent home to all school families via the eldest child today. These envelopes contain a letter outlining the process to complete and return your vote, summary statements from each candidate, the ballot paper and two envelopes. To vote you must mark 3 boxes by placing a clear mark beside each of the 3 candidates you select. Then place the completed ballot paper into one of the envelopes and then place that envelope into the second and ensure your name and address is written on the back of it. This can then be delivered in person to the office or post to the school before the closure of the ballot at 4pm on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> February. You can also directly place the envelope containing the vote into the ballot box at the office and print your name and address in the register of voters.

The votes will be counted on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> March and results announced on that day.

Our first School Council for the year will be held on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> March at 6.45pm in the Library.

At this meeting, we will elect our School Council office bearers including our School Council President. We will also organise the membership of our sub-committees. The actual core work of our School Council is achieved via our sub-committees and we encourage parents to become involved with these each year. I will outline the role of each sub-committee and the meeting schedule after this first School Council meeting.

#### **SCHOOL TOURS 2020**

I have started to host a school tour each week as we begin our enrolment program for 2020. 


