CLUBS @ GREENHILLS



I am always impressed and amazed by the passion, leadership and initiative of Greenhills Primary School students. My photos this week highlight a GREAT example of this which is our student led clubs. Every week students across our school are keen to share their ideas for a lunchtime club. They then work with their peers to see if these ideas can actually turn into a club that operates each week. We currently have a range of clubs running including our Coding & Scratch Club which is organised by a very dedicated and committed group of Year 3/4 students (shown in the photos). GETTING TO SCHOOL ON TIME!

As I walk around our school each morning I see many students arriving late. This year we introduced a slightly earlier 8.57am bell with accompanying music. The aim being to provide students the opportunity to enter their classroom and get organised for the day which starts at 9am sharp. We need all students to arrive no later than 8.55am so that we can maximise our learning each day. Arriving at 9am when the bell goes is late. You would be amazed at the effect of even a few minutes late each day can have over a longer time frame. Bread Tags for Wheels is a foundation that collects bread tags, sells them to a recycler and uses that money to purchase a wheelchair for those in need. Parade College is currently collecting bread tags to help a fellow student and has asked for our help.

Bread tags come in many shapes, sizes and colours. Made of High Impact Polystyrene they have a good recycling value. It takes 200 bread bags full of tags that are packed into 10 black bags or 200 kg of tags to bring in enough money to buy one wheelchair. Having a wheelchair gives the recipient independence and mobility and this makes a big difference to their families as well.

DEVELOPING HOME-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

Teaching boys to respect women by Dr Rosina McAlpine

Most studies shows that a boy's disrespect towards girls generally begins in childhood. Disrespect shows in small behavioural ways that can often be ignored or go unnoticed. These behaviours include teasing, using put-downs and through verbal bullying and harassment. We can break the cycle when by teaching our children to be respectful and caring toward all genders from a young age.

Start the conversation about respect early

Start by responding to your child calmly when they are disrespectful to others. The following three-step communication approach can be used from early childhood through to teen years. Let's put it into practice.

If a boy is making fun of his sister or a female friend:

Stop: Respond calmly rather than react asking him to stop the teasing. It's handy to have a phrase you can rely on when under pressure. For instance, "Stop please. That's a personal put down. We don't use put downs in this family."

Empathise: Invite your son to see the behaviour through the eyes of his sister. 'How do you think your sister/friend feels right now?'

Educate: Provide options such as ignoring his sister or friend if she's annoying him or providing an appropriate social script he can use to communicate his thoughts such as, "I find it annoying when you don't share the computer"

The acronym **SEE** (stop, empathise, educate) will help you remember these steps.

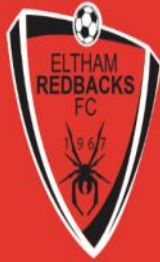
