WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst a sample of randomly selected parents at each school.

It is designed to assist our school in gaining an understanding of parents' perception of school climate, student engagement and relationships with our parent community. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

The survey will be conducted online by ORIMA Research Pty Ltd and only takes 15 minutes to complete. The survey can be accessed via desktop computer, laptop, tablet or mobile at any convenient time within the fieldwork period from Monday 7th August to Sunday 27th August.

An invitation to complete the survey was sent home to randomly selected families. These names have been generated via a DET computer system and all responses to the survey are anonymous .

The survey results will be reported back to our school at the end of September.

SCIENCE ACTION TEAM



As part of our 2019 Annual Implementation Plan, we expanded our Year 5/6 leadership program to include an Action Teams model. To launch this at the beginning of the year, we surveyed all of our Year 5/6 students around the things they would like to do more of and things they could do to improve our school. Using this information, we developed 10 different teams that students could then select into and work in each week over the year. Our aim being to provide broader opportunities for students to develop leadership, thinking and interpersonal skills and build higher levels of student engagement and inquiry.

On Monday of this week, our Science Action Team participated in an intensive incursion program called “The Lab” delivered by the Mini Boss Group.

The day began with our Year 5/6 Science leaders further developing their science inquiry skills and learning more about specific scientific concepts and vocabulary e.g. identifying the catalyst that causes a chemical reaction. They then used this knowledge to help run two hands on science lessons for all of our Year 3/4 students.

It was GREAT to see our science leader’s skills and confidence grow during the day and it also provided us with an important insight and example of how we might be able to extend the science curriculum across our school.

Well done to our Science Action Team and thank you to Janine Hough for organising this event and leading this team.

Bread tags come in many shapes, sizes and colours. Made of High Impact Polystyrene they have a good recycling value. It takes 200 bread bags full of tags that are packed into 10 black bags or 200 kg of tags to bring in enough money to buy one wheelchair. Having a wheelchair gives the recipient independence and mobility and this makes a big difference to their families as well.

DEVELOPING HOME-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

Language of independence building

Families always develop shared language around the values that have strong meaning for them. It is through shared language that culture exists. If you are looking to building a culture of independence in your family then creating your proprietary language around independence is a great way to start. Over the next few weeks, Contact will feature twelve examples of independence-building language and principles behind them that will help you create your own family's language.

"Never regularly do for a child the things a child can do for him or herself" **Goal:** Independence

This is perhaps the original parenting-for-independence manifesto, and it is a philosophy that guides many teachers and parents today. In effect, this sentence means that wherever possible we give children the skills and competencies to look after themselves physically and emotionally. It requires a great deal of patience, time and courage from parents and teachers as the sentence is easier to say than put to put into practice. However, it is a worthy guiding principle that leads to self-sufficiency in children, and ultimately redundancy as parents.

"Is this something you can do?" **Goal:** Self-help

Independence takes many forms but perhaps the most common is the development of self-help skills. The confidence, pride and, for most, sheer pleasure that kids doing the simple things for themselves such a toddler tying his shoelaces or a child making his own lunch is immeasurable. Yet well-meaning parents and adults who see it as their job to do everything for children so easily deny it. Independence begins at home with the development of self-help skills.

"Have you checked the help roster today?" **Goal:** Contribution

A great way to develop a sense of independence is to give kids opportunities to help at home. There is no need to overburden children with jobs, but a sensible allocation of chores according to their age and study requirements is not only a great help to you, but fantastic training for them. It also builds accountability and a work ethic, both highly valued characteristics for continuing success at school and later in life.

Reliability is closely connected to responsibility and other aspects of independence. Every child over the age of five, at the eldest, should do something that someone else relies on whether it is looking after a pet, clearing the meal table or emptying the garbage on a regular basis.

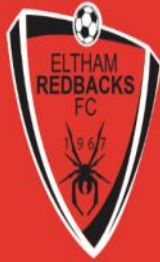
