

FROM THE PRINCIPAL ...

As we know, the benefits of reading to children are well researched and documented. Reading out aloud to children not only strengthens family bonds and provides positive interactions, but it also stimulates imagination and expands children's understanding of the world. It helps them to develop oral language and listening skills and prepares them to understand the written word.

When children are young, we know the value of bedtime stories and of hearing them read their school books aloud. What it is important to remember however, is how beneficial it is to maintain this practice even once your child is old enough to read independently. Recent studies into this indicate that the majority of students no longer read with their parents or are read to once they reach the age of 9 or 10.



Benefits of reading aloud (and with) older children include:

- Letting them experience the joy of a story particularly important for those who find reading difficult.
- Modelling of fluent, expressive reading.
- Expansion of vocabulary children generally have an auditory comprehension that is higher than their reading comprehension so if you choose a book your child could not read independently then you are exposing them to a rich new vocabulary of words.
- Exposure to a range of new authors, books and genres.

Perhaps one of the biggest benefits of shared reading though is the opportunity to build and develop comprehension skills. Understanding is the key to being a successful reader and as children's reading proficiency increases, the complexity of the books that they choose also increases. By discussing books with children we can help them to connect the book to their own experiences and to other books that they have read. We can help them to develop a deeper understanding of what they have read and to really engage with the text.

So please continue to hear your child read. Model a love of books and reading as it is something they will keep with them forever.


At the meeting we also confirmed our sub-committee structure for 2019. These are:

EXPLICIT TEACHING

This week we unpack the "Explicit Teaching" element of our Greenhills Instructional Model. As the name suggests, this section of a lesson is where the teacher models the skills or concept in a step-by-step way. Our teachers focus on delivering clear instructions and scaffold the learning to provide students with opportunities to grasp, develop and apply the knowledge or skill. The use of practice examples, often using concrete material, is one effective strategy used. Explicit teaching helps to reduce errors or misunderstandings throughout the learning sequence.



GOALS & TARGETS FOR 2019

At Greenhills Primary School, our vision is to provide a safe and nurturing learning environment that empowers all students to embrace learning to achieve their personal best and build their emotional, social and physical well-being.

To deliver this vision, we set specific goals and targets over a four-year strategic planning period. Each year these goals and targets are then fine—tuned and articulated in a detailed Annual Implementation Plan (AIP).

In 2019, our AIP priority goals are:

- To maximise student learning through measuring student learning gain in Literacy & Numeracy across a 12-month period.
- To further increase student engagement in learning through the implementation of inquiry based learning and research and the use of preferred learning styles.
- To develop student voice and input through effective, valued student leadership opportunities.
- To develop and promote resilient students who display Greenhills Primary Schools' behaviours and attitudes.
- To allocate resources strategically with an emphasis on improving teacher practice and consequently, student outcomes.

I have included a 2-page summary of our 2019 AIP in this newsletter, which outlines in more detail some of the key strategies and actions for our school this year.

PARENT HELPERS

Thank you to all of our parents and carers who have returned their Parent Helper Agreements. The response has been fantastic and we are so fortunate to have such strong community support for our school.

Our Parent Helper Agreement is a very important process that helps our school community understand that our school has a clear and public commitment to child safety in the form of our Child Safe Code of Conduct and Child Protection Reporting Policy. By including these policies as part of our parent helper requirement, our School Council has clearly defined and explained acceptable and unacceptable behaviours for staff, volunteers and children.

HOME SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP COMMUNICATIONS

As part of our 2020 Communications Plan, each area of the school will shortly be sending home a "mid-term" email. Thank you to our staff for being so pro-active around our home school communication.

Email is a great form of communication, however we are aware of the large number of emails our staff both receives and send each week. During the school day, teachers do not always have time to check their email or the email system may not be accessible. Whilst we aim to respond to emails within 48 hours, it is important that you do not have the expectation that teachers will answer these emails after school hours.

PARENTING TIPS

This part of the 'Contact' will feature positive parenting ideas and tips to help you successfully raise confident, happy and resilient kids.

Michael Grose is one of Australia's leading parenting and educational writers and speakers. This week features the first of his 'Top five parenting tips for this year.'

The start of the year is a great time for making changes and improvements to the way you raise kids. The trouble is, our good intentions towards change often become derailed around March, and we return to our default mode of parenting. Therefore, nothing much changes from year to year.

1. TIP OF THE WEEK - SWITCH ON YOUR KIDS' STRENGTHS

Most of us have been conditioned to focus on what kids can't do, but it is better to do the opposite. When we can unearth kids' strengths, we are, in effect, unlocking their true potential for success and happiness. Three elements come together to make a strength and parents need to be mindful of all three: performance (being good at something); energy (feeling good doing it) and high use (choosing to do it.) Rather than locking on to your child's weaknesses, set your antennae to your child's strengths.


