It is with very mixed emotions that I announce to our school community that we are saying farewell, thank you and best wishes to Kate Reade, who has accepted a position as Business Manager at Mernda Central. We will all miss her, but this is a wonderful opportunity for her to contribute to our State system by using her significant expertise and skills to lead the administration team at a much larger school with students from Prep – Year 12.

On behalf of our whole school community, I take this opportunity to thank Kate for her substantial service and contribution to our school. For over 10 years, Kate has always been dedicated to serving all members of our school community and ensured that we have run a very effective and organised office and school.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

My key message for this week is that Remote & Flexible Learning 2.0 is very different to the last time! It is different because:

- the novelty around learning at home will be wearing off much quicker than last time.
- there are more unknowns this time including how long it will last.
- the second wave of this virus is having more of an impact on our physical and mental health.
- we know that many of our working parents have less time to assist students at home because of the increased pressure around productivity as working from home processes are now more embedded.
- It may get harder each week for everyone involved because this is so different to what we normally do each day.

Most importantly though is that it is different this time around because we need our students to engage in learning new concepts and new curriculum content as opposed to the revision and consolidation work that was the focus last time.

This will be a challenge for all of us, but one I know that we can work through together.

Our work as a staff team is to ensure that our students are provided with the best possible program each day. This is a challenge in itself because of the huge variation in student engagement, ability, academic level and parent support available during this remote learning period. In a normal day and in a normal classroom, there is always a wide range of student needs that we cater for, however in this "new normal" these differences are amplified and we have less "reach" to deal with this because of the situation everyone across the world finds themselves in right now.

This means that we are continually adjusting, fine-tuning and adapting what we do and how we do it.

Our teaching teams are working together with our leadership team to focus on how we are providing feedback to students, how we can build greater differentiation and reduce the "one size fits all" model, how we can cater for those students who breeze through the work very quickly whilst also not overloading those that are finding it hard to complete one piece of work each day, how we can give students a sense of challenge and something to look forward to and of critical importance, how we can ensure that student connections with their friends and peers can be maintained.

How will we do this?

Our School Leadership Team (Janine Hough, Brad Ryan, Nigel Dunne, Jess Johnson and myself) meets formally each Monday to review the previous week and set actions in place for the next weeks. We also have a Remote Learning Leadership Team which consists of our Literacy & Numeracy Leaders and Student Agency & Inquiry Leaders from each team across the school (Betty Hajichristou, Bonnie Jones, Krysten O'Leary, Ros Mackie, Tracey Watts, Becc Stephens, Ashley Dunne, Bianca Fedele, Jon Mcfarland & Roberta lebbiano). This team along with the School Leadership team meet each Tuesday afternoon to gather feedback and data and then make key decisions that drive what we do each week.

Each teaching team and our Education Support teams also meets onsite each week to plan together and then prepare the future learning program. This helps us to ensure consistency across each grade level which is as important as ever right now. Our whole staff team also have regular staff meetings via Webex and staff engage with a range of professional learning activities as well.

We need your help too!

Through this challenging period, we need your input and guidance too. If you have any feedback, suggestions, questions, ideas then we need to hear them. How we deliver what we do will be very much built around the feedback we get from you and without this we are almost flying blind!

You can provide this directly via email to myself, Janine Hough or your child's teacher or by contacting the office and asking to speak with me directly. If I am unavailable at the time, I will contact you ASAP.

Next week I will send out the link to a short parent feedback survey. This will also be used to gather data and assist our decision making in future weeks.

FROM THE OFFICE

Dear parents and guardians,

COVID-19 has affected many families financially and we are aware that this may apply to you. We want to reach out to say that if you require any financial assistance with school payments, please do not hesitate to call or email James Penson or myself.

During the coming weeks, you will receive a system generated family statement outlining the status of your family school payments. If you are on a quarterly instalment payment arrangement, please note that this statement is for your information only. The third quarterly instalment for those who pay via Direct Debit has been processed, and those who self-manage these payments can do so through BPAY or QKR.

If you are leasing a netbook for a Year 6 student and making term payments, the third payment is due this week. If you have a Direct Debit agreement in place for these payments, this will be processed administratively.

We are aware that some family school payments included events which have not or may not go ahead due to COVID-19. We would like to reassure those who have either paid family school payments upfront or in instalments that a credit will be made to their family account. Please note that this credit will not be processed until around the beginning of October 2020 once events have been confirmed. Below is a list of the events which credits may be applied to;

- Excursion Payment \$70
- Prep and Year 3 & 4 Swimming \$75
- Year 5 & 6 Interschool Sport \$160
- Choir \$60
- Carnivals \$50 (\$10 for Cross Country and \$15 for Athletics Carnival) Please note that the Swimming Carnival (\$25) took place on 13/02/2020


