FROM THE PRINCIPAL

INQUIRY LEARNING SIZZLING AWAY



It has been GREAT seeing our Inquiry Learning really starting to take shape this term. Each area has commenced with a “Sizzling Start” and this has then led to some wonderful examples of student agency and voice across the school.

One example of this is our Year 1/2 Team who organised an Inquiry Trivia event in the hall on Tuesday afternoon. The questions were based on a student survey of all the things that they are interested in learning about through this Inquiry. This included dinosaurs, Space, environment, human body, reptiles, animals and more. A range of games between rounds and a natural sense of competitiveness ensured that the event was a huge success and highlights the power of students being switched onto learning.

SCREEN TIME – HOW MUCH IS ENOUGH

This week our students have started to write a persuasive text entitled “Children Should Only Have One Hour of Screen Time Per Day”. When I saw a class engaged with this yesterday, it got me thinking about what exactly does our role as a school and as parents need to be in this very topical issue.

I think it is fair to say that in general, most of us would believe that excessive screen time isn’t good for anyone and in particular children and their developing brains. With the rapid rise of online gaming such as Fortnite (which please note is recommended for children over the age of 14) it is not uncommon to hear that some of our students are spending countless hours and often very late nights in front of a screen.

Technology use and its impact on children is an issue that has become very prevalent as the use and dependence on devices in our lives has increased. While the amount of time children spend using screen based technology differs among families, the impact is becoming more and more evident in students conversations, interactions in the classroom and playground.

As part of our Home School Partnership, we plan to organise a parent information night around screen time and cyber safety later this year. As a school community, it is important to be informed about the ways our students are using and interacting with technology as well as what the current research is telling us.

In these articles, it outlines the following (evidence based) recommendations around screen-time / online gaming:

No more than 40 minutes a night on school nights

No more than an hour a day on weekends

No games where the objective is to kill people.

No games until all the homework and jobs at home are all done (including getting everything ready for school the next day).

While these recommendations won't work for all families, I encourage all families to work out an agreement or set of rules for technology use at your home.

Bread Tags for Wheels is an foundation that collects bread tags, sells them to a recycler and uses that money to purchase a wheelchair for those in need. Parade College is currently collecting bread tags to help a fellow student and has asked for our help.

Bread tags come in many shapes, sizes and colours. Made of High Impact Polystyrene they have a good recycling value. It takes 200 bread bags full of tags that are packed into 10 black bags or 200 kg of tags to bring in enough money to buy one wheelchair. Having a wheelchair gives the recipient independence and mobility and this makes a big difference to their families as well.

DEVELOPING HOME-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIPS

Developing Home-School Partnerships - Helping Kids Feel Good By Doing Good

Feel good activities give kids a rush of euphoria, but leave them craving for more. Doing good, however, is the key to living a more meaningful and happier existence. Research shows that altruistic behaviours are associated with better wellbeing, health and longevity. In short, we feel good when we do good.

The easiest way to help kids attain happiness is to encourage them to be kind. Kids want to be kind; they know it makes them happy! Even very young kids find helpful and kind acts to be intrinsically rewarding.

If kids want to help because it helps them feel great, it is our job to help fulfill this natural inclination by guiding them to age-appropriate opportunities to do so.

Teaching Our Kids to Do Good

- Role model helpfulness and kindness. Children learn to be helpful and kind by copying the significant adults in their lives.
- Encourage them to perform small acts of kindness. Being kind, giving a compliment, helping to tidy up- these small acts are just as powerful and effective as larger tasks such as looking after a pet for a neighbour.
- Make helping a family project. Get your kids involved when you take a meal to a family who have just had a new baby, or visit a sick friend in the hospital.
- Be a good neighbour. Help your kids learn to keep an eye on others, whether it is a neighbour, or a child on their sports team. Teaching your kids to notice what is going on in the lives of people in their community promotes awareness and empathy.
- Be grateful. Expressing gratitude is one of the best ways to do good. In fact, nothing can improve your life (and the life of others) like gratitude.

Doing good deeds is what makes us human. It lifts burdens from others, and lifts us by activating the joyful part of our brains. Teaching your kids to do good is the best way to help them have lasting 'feel good' feelings.
