GETTING READY FOR 2021

From the start of next year, Jess will be leading our Tutor Learning Program as part of the additional funding our school received to help students catch up. There has been much thought and consideration given to building our team structure for next year as there are many factors that need consideration. Each year schools have staff that take leave or seek opportunities at other schools. We also move staff into different areas to develop their teaching knowledge and practice and try to ensure a balance across teams with teacher's individual strengths and take into account their preferences. Also considered are teacher time fractions and other requests. In many ways, it is a very similar process to how we place our students into grades.

Please also remember that changes to these staff placements could also occur if any last minute departures happen or if we have significant changes to enrolment numbers.

CHRISTMAS CONCERT UPDATE

We have had lots of questions about our Christmas Concert and with the release of the latest Operations Guide I can confirm that we will not be able to host the event as normal. School have a strict gathering limit of 300 people outdoors. This includes teachers and parents. Given that we have over this number of families we cannot open the event to parents and carers. Instead, each class will film their item and special message and send out as a link to families. These links will all be sent in a combined email on Tuesday 15th December. This way families can all sit together and watch these items at a time that suits. Not perfect I know, but the best give the year we have had and conditions we still have to operate by. Let's all look forward to a GREAT Christmas Concert that is even bigger and better than anything before in 2021.


START UP 2020 DATES & TIMES

Parent Partnerships

Building deep emotional connections with kids By Michael Grose

Imagine your child comes to you upset that a sibling or friend has cheated in a game. There are a number of ways to respond, including telling them not to worry ("Let it go!"), advising them how to handle it ("Next time you keep the score.") or empathising emotionally ("You must feel disappointed.")

Each is a legitimate response for a parent and teacher to make, but only the latter builds a deep emotional connection. Importantly, the empathetic response builds a child's or young person's emotional intelligence as it taps into their ability to recognise current feelings.

How emotional connection works

Kids crave to be understood by others, especially by the people they love or respect. When you accurately feedback how a child or young person is feeling you demonstrate that you really care. Strong relationships are formed on the bedrock of care, kindness and compassion.

How to give emotional feedback that connects

Giving accurate emotional feedback to an upset child or teenager takes practice. It requires that you pay attention, move into the present moment, listen to a child and identify the feeling behind their words. High or loud emotions such as anger, annoyance and panic are often easier to identify than low or muted emotions such as worry, discouragement or loneliness.

An effective way to connect on emotional level is to listen to what a child has to say, and then think back to a time you were in a similar situation. Imagine if a child says they feel horrible because their friends laughed at them when they made mistake in class. Rather than respond immediately, think back to a time when you made a mistake in front of others and identify how you felt. Embarrassed, ashamed, or annoyed? "I bet that you felt embarrassed and annoyed when your friends laughed at you." Your child may tell you that you're off the mark, but they'll more than likely appreciate the empathy you show.

Feedback the positive emotions too

You don't have to wait until something challenging happens to connect with a child on an emotional level. Accurately mirror positive feelings such as relief (after a stressful situation has passed), enthusiasm (as they begin something they love doing) and chilled (as they put their feet up at the end of the day). We all experience many emotions throughout the day. The ability to accurately recognise and feed back the emotions of children and young people is a wonderful way to build connections of quality and depth.
