#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### STUDENT LEADERSHIP DAY

Yesterday, our Year 6 School Leaders which included Junior School Council, House Captains & Specialist Captains attended a full day leadership conference. This was run on-site and organised by Mrs Emmerling based on the GRIP Leadership program that was unable to be run earlier in the year.

Mrs Hough and I opened the day with a short key note. Our message was that a leaders role is to:

- Make a positive difference
- Put the needs of others first
- Challenge yourself and others to always do your best

Thank you to Rachel Emmerling for running the day and for her ongoing work along with David Symeonidis and Tegan Smith with our Junior School Council each week.

#### **PARENT PAYMENTS**

On an annual basis School Council reviews the budget and sets the level of essential and voluntary financial contributions required from parents' to meet the needs for the next school year. Following careful consideration, School Council has decided to freeze our 2021 Parent Payments at the same rate as they were in 2020.

Our Parent Payments are broken into 3 categories as follows:

- ESSENTIAL STUDENT LEARNING ITEMS TOTAL: \$190 per student + Booklist Cost + Excursion Fee
- **OPTIONAL ITEMS:** These are items, activities or services that are **optional** and are offered on a user-pays basis and which parents/guardians may **choose** whether their child accesses or participates in, for example: iPad Lease Program, Instrumental Music Tuition, Choir Program etc.
- **VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS:** These payments are incredibly important for our school. In 2020 we received voluntary payments from over 40% of our families. This assisted us to ensure our facilities and grounds were well maintained, purchase valuable learning resources in maths, literacy, Library and ICT resources.

A '2021 Parent Payment Notice' which outlines the charges pertaining to your child will be sent home next week. Payments are due by 1<sup>st</sup> March 2021, however payments can also be made this year before Friday 11th December or at the very start of Term 1 next year.

I know that this year has been very challenging and that many of our school families have been heavily impacted financially. It is important to know that we can support you so that all students at our school have what they need at all times.

As such I have arranged the following measures to assist families with Parent Payments.

#### 1. Instalment Plan

Payments are four equal amounts each term, with no financial penalty. If paying by instalments, the due dates are outlined on the '2021 Parent Payment Notice'.

#### 2. Hardship Application

If you are experiencing hardship or financial difficulties and are unable to make any type of school payment including those listed in this letter, please contact me (nominated parent payment contact person) at the school to discuss options including an alternative payment plan or access to our Family Support Fund. These conversations are always kept confidential.

#### 3. Family Support Fund

School Council has established a Family Support Fund. This fund is set up to provide funds for families to make important school payments such as excursions, camps, access to technology, books, uniforms and any other cost directly associated with attending our school. Donations to this fund can be made by contacting our office. This includes directing any refunds from 2020 that you may be receiving to this fund. Thank you to those families and individuals who have already made donations to this fund. This includes a very generous donation of \$1,000 by one of our families.

I am also pleased to announce that we were successful in becoming part of the School Breakfast Club program. This will commence next year and include the provision of breakfast, lunch and holiday food packs for those families that require it. I will provide more detail about this program over the next few weeks including putting a shout out for parent volunteers to assist to run the program each week.

#### WE ARE MOVING TO COMPASS

Next year we are moving to a new school management system called Compass.

This will replace our current use of Sentral.

Compass will be familiar to some families as a number of our local secondary schools use it. Part of the decision to move to Compass was based on parent feedback around the number of different platforms the school currently uses and how these can be confusing. We hope that Compass will streamline communication and provide access to information such as student reports and other data in an easier way. It will also improve many of the school's administration processes including school payments, excursion permissions and future newsfeeds.

From the end of this school year, families will not have access to Sentral anymore. As such, I encourage you to take a few minutes to download, save and or print out all of the Semester reports for your child/ren so that you have permanent access to them. (Please note that with our roll over into Compass, the school will transfer student reports and other important data. However, this will not be accessible to parents).

#### **School Payments**

**2021 School Charges** have now been applied to family accounts, statements and fees notices will be coming home next week

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic the school, in line with the Department of Education's directive, had to make the hard decision to cancel all school activities during this time such as excursions, interschool sport, camps and swimming for this year.

We are aware that some families have already paid money towards the 2020 Excursion Levy, Interschool Sports Levy and District Athletics. Where activities have not taken place this year the school has credited families for the portion that did not take place.

Where possible any money paid towards the 2020 Excursion Levy, Interschool Sports Levy (Grade 5 & 6 students only) or District Athletics will be re-directed towards the 2020 Essential Education Items. Any remaining credit will carry over into 2021.

Also this year, due to the current situation, the Department of Education is allowing schools to use the 2020 CSEF money to help families pay for Essential Education Items.

#### **Credits**

CSEF FAMILIES: Families who received the CSEF will be credited the amount that has been used towards activities and this money will be re-directed to any outstanding Essential Education Items costs and any remaining balance will carry over into 2021 just like the CSEF normally does

NON CSEF FAMILIES: Families who paid for the excursion, sport or athletics levies will have this money re-directed against any outstanding Essential Items costs and any remaining money will be held in credit for the family to use in 2021.

#### **Refunds**

If your family account is in credit after all outstanding charges have been paid then you will be able to request a refund or have the option to donate to either of the following Voluntary Contributions:

BUILDING FUND, SUBJECT CONTRIBUTION FUND or FAMILY SUPPORT FUND.

If your account is in credit the paperwork will be sent out with your statement next week.

COVID-19 has affected many families financially and we are aware that this may apply to you. We want to reach out to say that if you require any financial assistance with school payments, please do not hesitate to call or email the Principal, James Penson.

#### **Graduation Bears**

If you order a Graduation Bear and your account is in Credit we will not process the payment but allocate the cost against the credit on your account. Any cash received for graduation bears will be returned to your child.

Graduation will not be a separate charge this year but will form part of the excursion levy.

### Parent Partnerships - Give kids a thumbs up for the right things

#### **Advice from Michael Grose**

Children of all ages enjoy parental recognition. They like when their parents make a fuss over their behaviour or highlight something they have done well.

Sometimes parents will reward their children's behaviour with a treat, money, or a gift. This is okay in small doses, but parental recognition alone is a high enough driver of children's behaviour most of the time.

First borns, in particular, love approval. Youngest children just love that you have noticed them! Second borns can sometimes do things in spite of their parents, but deep down they love the recognition too, even if they don't let on that they do.

#### The behaviour you focus on expands

If you want your kids to be neater then focus on their neat behaviours. "You've tidied your toys up before dinner. Top job!" You don't have to throw a party, just let them know that you noticed and you approve of their tidiness. You may also let them know how it affects you. "You've tidied your toys up before dinner. It makes my job easier." The behaviours that you notice and comment on will expand.

Noticing kids' tidiness once won't suddenly turn messy kids into exceptionally neat ones but do it often enough and you'll start to get some turn around.

You can give kids a thumbs up for all sorts of behaviours. Here's some examples.

#### Being co-operative

Stubborn kids need a pat on the head when they respond on your terms not theirs.

#### **Being brave**

Nervous and anxious kids need to have their bravery pointed out to them. It's reassuring and empowering.

#### Being helpful

Want helpful kids? Then you need to notice helpful behaviours.

#### **Being tolerant**

Sometimes older siblings need to be very tolerant of younger siblings. Tolerance is a very giving behaviour and should be promoted.

#### **Being patient**

Something to encourage in boys, in particular. It's often not their strong point.

#### **Being persistent**

Let kids know when 'hanging in there' pays off. The link between persistence and success is massive but persistence needs to be promoted. It's also the one factor of temperament that can be affected by parenting.

#### **Being friendly**


If your child struggles in social situations then recognise pro-social behaviours such as sharing, initiating contact with another child or taking an interest in another person.

Don't wait until you get perfect behaviour to give recognition, particularly for very young children. Kids have L-plates when it comes to behaving (co-operatively, bravely, patiently) so their attempts and close approximations need to be verified by the significant adults in their lives – their parents.

Recognising kids' positive behaviours is easy to do, but it's also easy not to do. We often get tied up with other things and forget to show appreciation and nurture the behaviours our kids need to develop. It's important to be aware of this. It's the little things such as giving positive recognition that have the biggest impact on kids' development.
